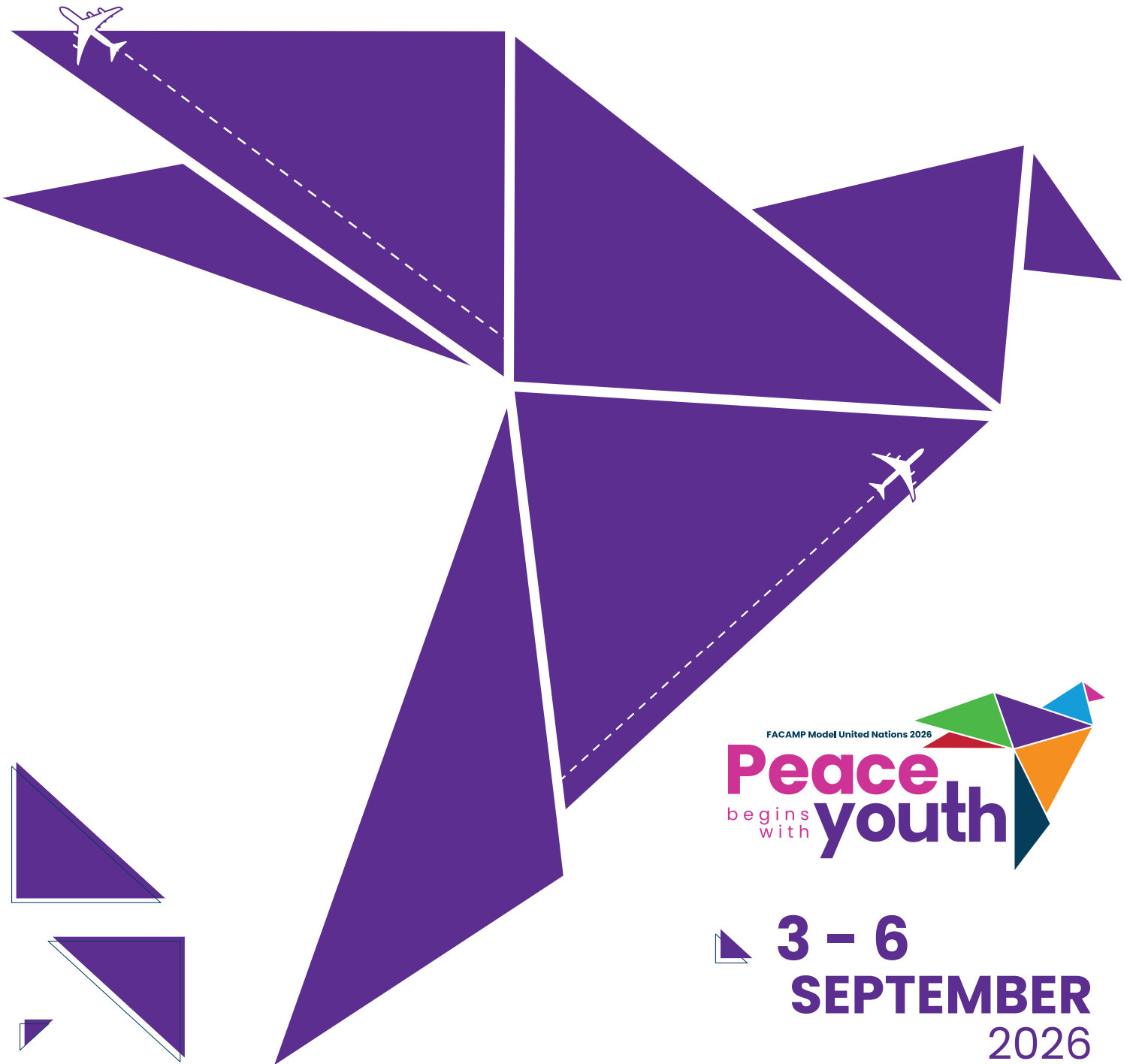

SUMMARY

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VISA REQUIREMENTS

In most cases, Brazil adopts a policy of reciprocity regarding visas. This means that nationals of countries that require visas for Brazilian citizens will need a visa to travel to Brazil. According to Brazilian law, Brazil needs to sign an agreement, on a reciprocal basis, to offer visa waivers to nationals of other countries.

According to the Website of the Brazilian Ministry of Foreign Affairs:

“The visit visa will be issued to foreigners traveling to Brazil for staying up to 90 days without purposes of immigration or the exercise of paid activity (daily allowances, artistic paychecks, compensation, or other travel expenses are allowed). Visit visas can be granted for those traveling for tourism, business, transit, artistic or sports activities, study, volunteer work, or to attend conferences, seminars, or meetings, among other purposes – provided there is no remuneration in Brazil and the stay does not exceed 90 days”.

Visa for minors

The visa application for citizens under 18 must be accompanied by travel written consent of either parent, legal guardians, or competent judicial authority.

HOW TO APPLY FOR A BRAZILIAN VISA

To apply for a visa, foreigners must submit the visa application form duly completed, a valid travel document, proof of payment of consular fees, an International Certificate of Immunization – when necessary –, and other specific documents for the type of visa requested.

After completion, the applicant must print and sign the receipt, and the original documentation must be presented at the Brazilian Consulate where your visa application will be processed. IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS TO TRAVEL TO BRAZIL

Anvisa (National Health Surveillance Agency) and the World Health Organization (WHO) recommend that foreigners visiting Brazil be immunized against Yellow Fever and Malaria. It is recommended to issue the International Certificate of Immunization to guarantee entry into the country. Other health orientations

Visit Your Doctor

Before coming to Brazil, make sure to check with your doctor and dentist that you are in your best shape.

Special Needs and Allergies

If you have special needs or are allergic, make sure to bring with you sufficient supplies to Brazil. Bring enough medicines for the time you will spend here and be sure to bring the prescription for the medicines that you will need as well. If you need to take medication regularly, bring a letter from your doctor that has detailed your treatment.

Regular Medicines

If you choose to bring medicines of common use, always have medicines for headaches, fever, coughs, etc.

Health Insurance

The Brazilian health system is divided into two services: (1) A universal free service called SUS, available to all citizens and foreigners in Brazil, and; (2) Private hospitals and doctors that are paid. As the SUS system is mainly focused on lower-income people, and thus very crowded, all international students must travel with a

health insurance plan that covers expenses in private hospitals and allows repatriation for the entire stay in Brazil.

TRANSPORTATION

How to get to Campinas - choosing your airport

Two main airports serve the region of Campinas: São Paulo International Airport (Guarulhos) and Viracopos International Airport (Campinas).

How to get to Campinas (Barão Geraldo) from São Paulo International Airport (Guarulhos)

When you arrive at São Paulo International Airport (Guarulhos-GRU), search for an information desk and ask them about the LIRA BUS Company, which is located in Terminal 2, Platform 10 (take off from the main entrance and turn left). This company makes direct transfers from Guarulhos Airport to the Campinas bus station ("Rodoviária de Campinas" in Portuguese).

Upon arriving at LIRA BUS ask for a ticket to the bus station of Campinas. The ticket costs Brazilian R\$47,75 (around €10 and US\$ 10) for a two-hour journey.

Note that Airport taxis to Campinas are very expensive, so the bus is the best option. From Guarulhos International Airport to Campinas: around R\$ 330-430. Estimates using: <http://www.tarifadetaxi.com/campinas>

Once you get to Campinas, you need to take a taxi or Uber to get to Barão Geraldo.

How to get to Campinas (Barão Geraldo) from Viracopos International Airport (Campinas)

At Viracopos International Airport, the Aerocoop cooperative provides taxi services to airport passengers. The taxi stand is located outside the Passenger Terminal. There is a counter service inside the Passenger Terminal for Mastercard, Visa, and Amex payments. For payment in cash, speak directly to the driver. Ask the driver to take you to FACAMP or give him/her your hotel address.

Transportation in Campinas and Barão Geraldo

Campinas is a city that was not planned for public transportation. It has one of the highest car-to-inhabitant ratios in the country.

Bus

Barão Geraldo has a vast number of bus lines, with pricing around US\$ 1 per trip. Allow for extra time if you take buses because there can be delays in their schedule. You may not find bus transportation to all areas, and very few at night. Be especially careful with your safety at night.

If you are using public transportation, the app CittaMobi can help you find the approximate bus schedules and stops around Campinas.

Taxis

Taxis are expensive, but safe. You can call a taxi by phoning it: + 55 19 3288 0125 or + 55 19 3289 3300.

Uber

Uber is a transportation app that is very common in Campinas. Use it by downloading the App.

“Circular interno”

MONEY

In Brazil, it has become very common to pay all kinds of bills using a credit or debit card, even for small amounts.

You should not have any problem using your international card, either credit or debit, especially if it comes with a chip. Visa and MasterCard are the most famous flags.

If you want to pay with cash, our official currency is Real (R\$).

We recommend that you convert foreign currency to R\$ and carry it with you as you see best.

Carry the required details and have the hotline number handy for any cancellations or blockages in case you lose the card.

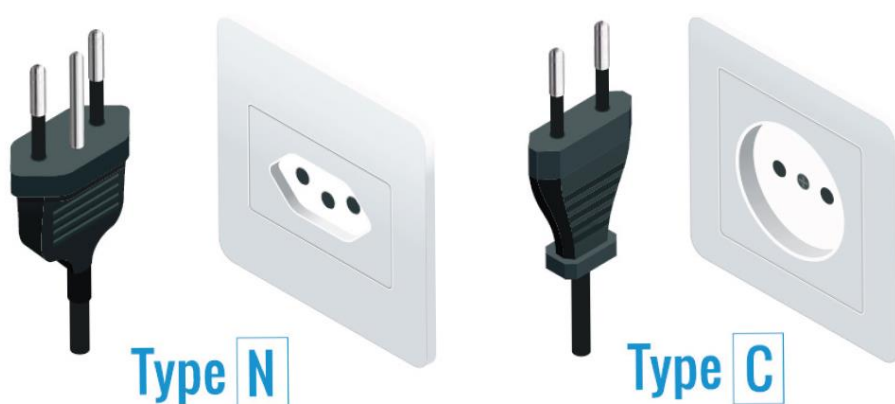
Please ensure that the associated telephone number registered with the bank is active throughout the travel period.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Plugs & Chargers

In Brazil, the electrical sockets are like the ones below (type C or N), and the voltage is usually 100 – 127 V (like in CAMPINAS), although in some places it is 220 V (especially in small cities). So, make sure your devices are dual voltage or try to get an adapter. We suggest you bring a Universal Adapter, so you will not have problems with any socket.



SIM Card for Mobile Phone

There are four cell phone operators in Brazil: Vivo, Claro, Tim, and Oi. They offer SIM cards (locally called CHIPS) that give access to call and data network services. There are prepaid and postpaid plans. You can buy a SIM card at the official operators' stores. You can also use an e-sim from companies such as Airalo and Holafly.

WI-FI is available in many establishments, so just ask for the "senha" (Portuguese for password).

Personal Computer or Laptop or Pads

Since most activities of the simulation require accessing online documents, it is recommended that you bring your personal computer, laptop, or pad. Please bring an extension cord since many delegates may use the plugs at the same time.

GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT CAMPINAS AND BARÃO GERALDO

The city of Campinas, São Paulo

FACAMP is located in Campinas, a countryside city in the state of São Paulo, Brazil. Campinas is one of the richest cities in Brazil, with 1.7 million inhabitants and a GDP per capita of U\$21,000 (almost 2 times the Brazilian average). It is a one-hour (90 km) ride from São Paulo, Brazil's major city and its economic center. Usually referred to as the Brazilian Silicon Valley, the city is known for its vocation for technological innovation and has many renowned universities, technology research centers, and highly valued global enterprises, such as 3M, Bosch, Honda, Motorola, Pirelli, and Samsung, among others.

Campinas was founded in 1774 as an outpost for the “Bandeirantes”, the original explorers who had frequent journeys inland in search of precious stones and Indian slaves. However, it became an important regional center in the 19th century, as agriculture needed more fertile soils, first for sugar cane and cotton, then for coffee. The coffee fever brought along with it the establishment of a very capillary railway network leading to the port of Santos for export, passing through the then-secondary city of São Paulo. Campinas quickly became the most important economic center of the province of São Paulo, and should have been its capital were it not for the yellow fever epidemics that decimated more than a quarter of its population. Anyway, the coffee golden years allowed the accumulation of capital necessary for the city's industrialization in the 20th century. Such an important agricultural center allowed the establishment of the first large-scale research center of newer rural technologies, the Instituto Agrônômico (Agronomic Institute).

Since the end of World War II, Campinas has become an important industrial hub attracting several European and American companies like Bosch and 3M. In the 1960s, the establishment of the second public university in the State of São Paulo (UNICAMP) consolidated the city as a national technological hub. Campinas now concentrates on technological centers, which makes it one of the leading research centers in the country.

FACAMP is in the district of Barão Geraldo (or simply Barão), which is around 15 Km from the Campinas downtown area. Barão looks like a small city within a large city, and it is full of students. The district life is focused around the UNICAMP (University of Campinas) campus, where FACAMP is located, so there are lots of academic and cultural activities.
